The "Rebirth in Action: Telling the Story of Freedom" initiative is designed to tell the story of freedom through art and cultural experiences to promote Houston Freedmen's Town as a monument of Black community, agency and heritage. The first phase of the project includes community engagement, artist-led activations through a continuation of CAMH's artist residency program CAMHLAB, an exhibition with renowned artist Theaster Gates, and infrastructure resiliency planning.
